#### Instructions to authors

The original typewritten or computer printed manuscript plus three copies must be submitted to the Scientific Editor. The manuscript must be accompanied by a letter stating that the paper has not been previously published, and all listed authors must sign the letter to indicate their agreement with the submission.

The manuscript should be typed in double spacing with generous margins on one side of the paper only. The first page should contain the title of the paper, the author(s) name(s) and address(es), *including e-mail addresses*, and the name and address *including e-mail* of the author to whom correspondence should be addressed. The abstract should be on a separate page. Tables and figures should be numbered consecutively and should be submitted on separate A4 pages attached to the manuscript. The appropriate positions in the text should be indicated. Illustrations should be clearly labelled on the back.

**NB Original figures and photographs, graphs, etc. must be submitted electronically as well as in hard copy: in jpg or .bmp format.**

A computer diskette with the manuscript in MS-Word format or a format accessible to this program must accompany the hard copy. *Authors' proofs will be sent by e-mail in Adobe Acrobat format, as .pdf files.* They can be read by means of Acrobat Reader, which can be downloaded free from [www.adobe.com](http://www.adobe.com).
